- Development of opportunities for the provision of mentoring to male students living on campus at SMBC, in cooperation with fellowship group leaders and the Community Care Team.
- Assist with Community and Student Care services in consultation with Director of Community and Student Care, as required.
- Represent the College within the wider Christian community.
- Compliance with SMBC WH&S, Privacy and other policies.
